IAR strives to rescue, transport and offer humane care to the animals in communities throughout Illinois and surrounding states.

In the past several years, a coalition of rescuers have saved thousands of adoptable pets: in 2007 over 6,000 precious lives were saved from untimely death, abandonment, neglect, abuse and unnecessary euthanasia. This was all accomplished through generous donations of volunteers that form IAR.
